In March of 2008 the Jackson County Drug Task Force received information that two brothers who had previously dealt crack cocaine in Grandview, MO had moved to Lone Jack, MO. and were continuing to sell narcotics.

Investigation confirmed that the two had recently rented residences in Lone Jack in close proximity to each other. Information continued to come in about the two brothers that provided accurate and up to date information about their activities.

In April of 2008 a search warrant was obtained for one of the brother's homes in Lone Jack. This led to the recovery of approximately one ounce of cocaine, a quantity of marijuana and a small marijuana grow operation, a stolen Glock .40 caliber handgun and 90 rounds of handgun and shotgun ammunition. The subject was not at home when the warrant was served.

Attempts were made to contact the other brother at his nearby residence. However, he was not at home or did not want to answer the door.

A few days after this both homes were vacated by the brothers.

In May of 2008 valid information continued to come in regarding their activities. It was learned that they had moved back to Grandview. Another search warrant was obtained on a residence that was frequented by them. This led to the recovery of a small amount of marijuana. While the warrant was being served one brother was located and arrested trying to leave different residence that was under surveillance by the JCDF.

As of this date one brother has warrants out for his arrest for parole/probation violation. It is expected that other charges will soon be filed. He is expected to be incarcerated when he is taken into custody. It is believed that he has fled the area.

The second brother is also on parole/probation. It is expected that his parole/probation will also be violated and that soon he too will be incarcerated.
